Recognition check

1. Stop Come to a complete stop, yield, then proceed when safe.	2. Yield Slow and give right of way when another road user has priority.
3. Do Not Enter Do not enter the roadway, ramp, or restricted direction.	4. Speed Limit Do not exceed the posted legal maximum under normal conditions.
5. Merge Check mirrors, adjust speed and space, and merge smoothly when safe.	6. School Crossing Slow, scan for children, and obey posted school-zone controls.
7. Railroad Crossing Ahead Prepare for tracks and obey lights, gates, or a crossbuck.	8. Slippery When Wet Reduce speed and avoid sudden steering or braking.
